- confused by our own expectations of victory (v 1; Matt 11:1-6)
- unsettled by fear (vs 2-3a; 1 Peter 5:8; Matt 10:28-31)
- prone to is olation (v 3b; Heb 10:25; Galatians 6:2)
- <u>immobilized</u> by self-<u>pity</u> (v 4; John 16:33)

God graciously gives us a fresh <u>r e v e l a t i o n</u> of <u>H i m s e l f</u> and His <u>m e t h o d s</u> (19:5-21)

God brings us to a place of:

- rest and refreshment
 (vs 5-8a; Psalm 91:1-2; Matt 11:28-30)
- a fresh <u>u n d e r t a n d i n g</u> of <u>W h o</u> He is (vs 8b-13; Job 42:1-6; John 20:24-29)
- receiving a <u>redirection</u> of our <u>ministry</u> (vs 14-18; Acts 9:1-5, 10-15)
- <u>serving</u> Him in <u>relationship</u> with others (vs 19-21; Ecc 4:9-12; 1 Cor 12:14-26)

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William Ward described discouragement with these words:

Discouragement is dissatisfaction with the past, distaste for the present, and distrust of the future. It is ingratitude for the blessings of yesterday, indifference to the opportunities of today and insecurity regarding strength for tomorrow. It is unawareness of the presence of beauty, unconcern for the needs of our fellowman, and unbelief in the promises of old. It is impatience with time, immaturity of thought, and impoliteness to God.
