God is <u>gracious</u> to give us many <u>opportunities</u> to <u>repent</u> (2 Kings 1:1-2a)

To get our attention, God *may* bring:

- outside opposition into our lives (v 1; 2 Kings 3:4-5;
 Daniel 5:21; Acts 17:24-28; Psalm 33:10-11)
- financial trouble into our lives (2 Chron 20:35-37)
- personal problems into our lives (v 2a)

Where we turn in hard times <u>reveals</u> Who we really <u>trust</u> (2 Kings 1:2b-4)

• Even when we don't seek God, He still seeks us (vs 3-4)

Our <u>refusal</u> to <u>repent</u> of our sin causes a progressive <u>hardening</u> of our hearts (2 Kings 1:5-18)

• God is faithful to warn us of danger (vs 5-8)

We should be careful:

- not to <u>challenge</u> God (vs 9-12)
- not to provoke God to judgment (vs 13-15)
- to h u m b l e ourselves before God (vs 16-18)
