Four women:

- Tamar the <u>d e c e i v i n q</u> "prostitute" (Matt 1:3; Gen 38)
- Rahab the <u>l v i n q</u> prostitute (Matt 1:5; Josh 2; 6:25)
- Ruth an <u>i n c e s t u o u s</u> past
 (Matt 1:5; Gen 19; Ruth 1-4; Deut 23:3)
- Bathsheba the dishonest <u>a d u l t e r e s s</u>
 (Matt 1:6; 2 Sam 11)

They speak to Christmas which reminds us:

Jesus came to <u>s a v e</u> the whole <u>w o r l d</u>
(John 3:16-21; Rom 1:16; 1 John 2:2; Luke 2:25-32)

Jesus didn't come for the <u>r i g h t e o u s</u> but to save <u>s i n n e r s</u> (Matt 9:12-13; Rom 3:10; 1 Tim 1:15)

The Gospel message of Jesus is <u>r e v e a l e d</u> through these four women's <u>l i v e s</u> (Mark 14:8-9)

- Tamar: salvation is for sinners (1 Tim 1:15)
- Rahab: salvation is through <u>f a i t h</u> (Heb 11:31)
- Ruth: salvation is of <u>g r a c e</u> (Gal 2:21)
- Bathsheba: salvation <u>h e a l s</u> our <u>b r o k e n n e s s</u>
 (2 Cor 5:17)

God's <u>g r a c e</u> does what sinners <u>c a n n o t</u> (Rom 5:15-21; 10:12-13; Eph 2:8; Titus 2:11)

Christmas reminds us that because of Jesus, <u>n o o n e</u> is beyond God's <u>g r a c e</u> and <u>s a I v a t i o n</u>!
