God can turn our places of defeat into places of victory
(8:1-29)

- I must be attentive to God's methods and strategies (vs 1-8)
- I must obey the word of God
(vs 9-29; Matt 7:24-27; Luke 6:46)
- I must renew my commitment to worship and obey Christ (vs 30-35; Deut 27-28; John 4:24)

I must beware of the deceptive works of the enemy
(9:1-27)

- I am to live by faith, not by sight
(vs 1-15; Exo 34:12; Prov 3:5-6; 2 Cor 5:7; 6:14; 11:14)
- When I make a mistake, admit it and make my mistake work for my benefit (vs 16-27; Gen 29-30)

I can trust God to use even my failures to accomplish His own purposes (10:1-43)

- God is able to bring victory out of my blunders
(vs 1-28; Gen 50:19-20)
- I am not to rest on my success but complete the work God has given me (vs 29-43; Acts 20:24; 2 Tim 4:7)
