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The **C o n t e x t** (John 4:43-46a)

- Familiarity breeds contempt (v 44; Luke 4:14-30)
- It's not what Jesus can do - it's who He is!  
(John 2:23-25)
- Cana is the place of Jesus' first recorded miracle  
(v 46a; John 2:11)

The **Growth of Authentic Faith is Realized....(John 4:46b-53)**

- by recognizing the power of Christ (vs 46b-48)  
Two problems this kind of faith causes are:
  - He presents the need before he ever presents himself  
(v 47)
  - He tells Christ how to handle the situation (v 47)
- by responding to the word of Christ (vs 49-50)
- by believing who Christ really is (vs 51-53)
  - Jesus is Lord over time, distance and sickness!

**Closing thoughts on our passage:**

- We are not to be seeking signs and miracles,  
we are to seek Christ.
- God can and does use adversity in our lives, adversity  
beyond our ability to fix, to bring us to Himself  
and trust in Him alone as our only hope and  
deliverance.
- Jesus wants to continually grow our faith in Him as the  
Lord over everything!
- We are to learn that God is sovereign and we are not.

**Growth Group**  
**Sermon Study Helps**  
John 4:43-54 (Week Ten)

**(Note: This guide is to help *facilitate* discussion with your Growth Group. Use it as a *RESOURCE* for the group in discovering and applying the truths of God's Word. There may be questions you *do not want to use* and there may be instances where the group *chooses to focus on a particular point, verse or truth*. This guide is to assist the group in growing in their relationship with Christ and the Scriptures, thus, it is not necessary to complete all of the points in the discussion guide...use this with flexibility and not as a rigid task list to get through. God's richest blessing upon you all.)**

**Intro:**

In this week's lesson we find Jesus returning to Cana in Galilee, the scene of His first miracle, there He is met by a man in great personal desperation. That is because his son, back in Capernaum, twenty miles away, is said to be dangerously ill and near death due to a severe fever. This man is described as an official, probably in Herod's court and he likely has heard of Jesus' prior miracle in Cana and in his great anguish, he sees Jesus as his last hope. The story is a story of the growth of personal faith as Jesus takes this man to a new awareness of ***who He is*** and ***reveals Himself as the sovereign God*** whose authority and power know no limitations when it comes to deliverance and healing.

**Discussion Questions**

Why do you think Jesus went to His home area of Galilee even when He knew that 4:44 was true? What does that say about His character and His mission?

How many miracles did Jesus do in Samaria? How is the response of the Jews and the people in Jesus' home area different than the response of the Samaritans earlier in chapter 4?

Why is there a natural tendency to seek the miraculous signs of God rather than pursue a relationship with Him (v 45)? What is the danger in this? What response on our part would be better and more pleasing to God?

How does Jesus respond to the man's request (4:48)? Is Jesus being harsh or mean? Why did He respond in this way?

What does v 50 tell us about the faith of the official regarding Jesus' command? Did the official have a choice to make when Jesus told him to "Go"? Do you think it was hard for the official to leave without Jesus going with him? Why or why not?

Describe the *progression of the official's faith* through the story and his encounter with Jesus (v 46-47...v 49-50...v 52-53) Have you had times of growth in your own faith? How did they happen? Explain.

What are the effects of the official's faith? How does his action correspond to the Samaritan woman's action upon coming to faith? What are the effects on others of your faith?

**Taking it to the streets....**

How important is it for Christians to believe without seeing miracles? What can we learn from this court official about what faith looks like? (cf Dan 3:17-18; John 20:24-29)

What are some things God has told us in His word that are hard for you to believe?

How do you need to trust God this week to handle a situation you can't control or work out on your own?
