John's Point: Jesus is G o d....

- the all-sufficient P r o v i d e r (6:1-13)
 - The S e t t i n g (vs 1-4)
 - The P r o b l e m (vs 5-9)
Is Jesus e n o u g h?
 - The M i r a c l e (vs 10-13)
His resources are u n l i m i t e d
- the all-sufficient S a v i o r (6:14-21)
 - The S e t t i n g (vs 14-15)
 - The P r o b l e m (vs 16-19a)
Is Jesus a b l e?
 - The M i r a c l e (vs 19a-21)
He is always in c o n t r o l

Principles to learn from these miracles:

- Jesus will bring about circumstances and situations in order to t e s t or p r o v e our faith
(Gen 22:1-19; 39:1-10; James 1:1-4)
- Jesus commands us to do m o r e than we are (*humanly*) a b l e to do because H e e n a b l e s us to do what He commands (Matt 28:18-20; 1 Cor 2:1-5; 2 Cor 12:9-10)
- Jesus is the One who abundantly s u p p l i e s and d e l i v e r s, we are to humbly r e c e i v e and faithfully d i s t r i b u t e what He provides.
(2 Ki 4:1-6; Lk 6:38, 19:26; Jn 3:27-29)
- Jesus has come into the world to be our P r o v i d e r and our S a v i o r....to be our b r e a d and to be our d e l i v e r a n c e
(Jn 6:35,42,48,58; Mk 10:44-45; Lk 19:10; Heb 7:23-25)
