The Quandary of Biblical Illiteracy (Deut 6:4-9; Josh 1:8; Psm 1; 119:97; 2 Tim 2:15; 3:16-17; Col 3:16)

- All followers of Christ (not just pastors) are to <u>read</u> and <u>know</u> the Scriptures in order to be <u>equipped</u> to serve God and <u>others</u>.
- A model of Biblical reformation King Josiah
 (2 Kings 22-23; 2 Chron 34-35)
 - He got rid of the <u>i d o l s</u> of the land <u>r e p e n t a n c e</u>
 (34:3-7)
 - He restored the <u>t e m p l e</u> <u>w o r s h i p</u> (22:3-7; 34:8-13)
 - He reestablished the <u>priority</u> of the <u>Scriptures</u> God's <u>Word</u> (22:8-20; 34:14-28)
- Which led to:
 - recommitting to the covenant (23:1-3; 34:29-33)
 - <u>reformation</u> of the <u>nation</u> (23:4-20; 34:33)
 - <u>obedience</u> of the <u>people</u> (23:21-23; 35:1-19)

What about me?

Do the idols of my life <u>d i s t r a c t</u> me from <u>e n g a g i n g</u> with God's Word? What steps will I take this week to remedy that?

Do I <u>replace</u> my need of God with <u>overconfidence</u> that I can get by without <u>worshipping</u> Him? How can I begin to change that?
