The Guilt Offering was required:

- for violating the “holy things” of the Lord (Lev 5:14-16)
- when one sins inadvertently against God’s commands (Lev 5:17-19)
- for sinning against God by defrauding a neighbor (Lev 6:1-7)
- additional details of the Guilt Offering (Lev 7:1-6; Num 5:5-10)

What can we learn from the Guilt Offering?:

- Every sin, at its basic level, is a sin against God (Psalm 51:4)
- A right relationship with God enables us to heal broken human relationships (Matt 5:23-25)
- Restoration becomes the evidence of true repentance (Luke 19:1-10)

Jesus foreshadowed in the Guilt Offering:

- Jesus was our Guilt Offering (Isa 53:10)
- Jesus satisfied God’s just character (1 John 2:1-2)
- Jesus has reconciled us to God and to each other (2 Cor 5:16-21)
