We are to conform to God's holiness:

- by <u>o b e y i n g</u> His <u>W o r d</u> (vs 1-10)
 - Receiving Hisprinciples of holy living (vs 2-4)
 - God looks for <u>proper worship</u> today (vs 5-8)
 - We are to <u>care</u> for the <u>less</u> <u>fortunate</u> (v 9-10)
- by <u>relating</u> to our neighbors in <u>love</u> (vs 11-18)
 - We are to be <u>h o n e s t</u> with others (vs 11-12)
 - We are not to take <u>a d v a n t a q e</u> of others (vs 13-14)
 - We are to <u>preserve</u> justice (vs 15-16)
 - We are to cultivate <u>love</u> in our <u>relationships</u> (17-18)
- by being <u>distinctive</u> from the <u>world</u> (vs 19-31)
 - <u>Culturally</u> (v 19)
 - Behaviorally (vs 20-22)
 - Devotionally (vs 23-25)
 - Remaining separate from worldly customs (26-31)
- by extending <u>kindness</u> and <u>iustice</u> to others (vs 32-37)
 - To the elderly and the foreigner (vs 32-34)
 - By being upright in dealing with others (vs 35-36a)
 - The <u>reason</u> (vs 36b-37)

Leviticus 19 - What does it mean for me?

It is important because:

- there is a <u>d i s t o r t e d</u> perception of <u>h o l i n e s s</u> among Christians.
- there is a <u>desperate</u> <u>need</u> for holy living in our <u>culture</u>.
- holiness is more than a matter of <u>o b s e r v i n g</u> religious
 <u>r i t u a l s</u>, it is to be part of one's <u>e v e r v d a v l i v i n q</u>.
- holiness is <u>costly</u> it involves <u>sacrifice</u>.

Seeing Jesus in Leviticus 19

- Jesus taught and lived a life of holiness that
 <u>revealed</u> the holiness of God to people (Lev 19:2, 18;
 Matt 5:43; 19:19; 22:37-39; Mark 12:31,33; Luke 10:27;
 Rom 13:9; Gal 5:14; James 2:8; 1 Peter 1:15-16)
- Both the <u>p o s i t i v e</u> and <u>n e g a t i v e</u> dimensions of God's holiness can be seen in the two <u>c o m i n g s</u> of Jesus Christ (John 3:17; 8:11; Rev 19:11-21)
