Faithful o b e d i e n c e brings God's b l e s s i n g  
(Lev 26:1-13)

- The issue of blessings and punishment are related to one's r e l a t i o n s h i p and r e s p o n s e to G o d (vs 1-2)
- As children of God, we p o s s e s s God's f a v o r and blessings, but it is another thing to e n j o y them (vs 3-10; 2 Peter 1:3; Eph 1:3; Matt 6:25; Rom 8:31-39; Heb 10:19-22)
- Because our b o d i e s are now the d w e l l i n g place of God, we must be d e t e r m i n e d to use them for God's g l o r y (vs 11-13; 1 Cor 6:15-20; Eph 4:17-32)

Continued d i s o b e d i e n c e brings God's d i s c i p l i n e  
(Lev 26:14-39)

- The j u d g m e n t of God is j u s t as the punishment fits the s i n (vs 16-39)
- The principle remains t r u e - we r e a p what we s o w (Gal 6:7-8; 1 Cor 3:10-15)

R e p e n t a n c e brings f o r g i v e n e s s and r e s t o r a t i o n (Lev 26:40-46)

- God's desire is that His d i s c i p l i n e leads to r e p e n t a n c e (vs 40-41; Prov 3:11-12; Heb 12:4-11)

Seeing Jesus in Leviticus 26.....

- The future history of God's people rests upon God's work in the p a s t and is affirmed in the f u t u r e through the work of Jesus Christ (Lev 26:13, 44-45; Phil 1:6)
- God never i n t e n d e d the world to look to the Law of Moses for e t e r n a l b l e s s i n g s, but to look to Another - the Lord Jesus Christ (John 1:17)
