The <u>h u m a n i t v</u> of Jesus <u>e n a b l e d</u> Him to:

- <u>r e g a i n</u> mankind's lost <u>d e s t i n y</u> (vs 2:5-9; Ps 8:4-6; Gen 1:26-28; Rom 8:19-22; 1 Cor 15:45; Eph 1:20-23; Phil 2:6-8)
- <u>restore</u> our <u>unity</u> (vs 2:10-13; Ps 22:22; Isa 8:17-18; John 17:20-23; 1 Cor 12:12-13)
 - "Author" = leader, <u>captain</u>, <u>pioneer</u>
- disarm Satan and deliver us from death (vs 2:14-15;
 1 Cor 15:51-57; Col 2:13-15)
- <u>relate</u> to us in our <u>weakness</u>
 (vs 2:16-18; Ps 103:13-14; Gal 3:29; 1 Tim 2:5; 1 Jn 1:1-2)

The point:

- Christ's *superiority to the angels* was not contradicted by the <u>incarnation</u> (His humanity) nor by His <u>suffering</u>.
- Christ's incarnation fulfills God's intention for the whole human family through His ministry as the <u>Savior</u>, Pioneer, <u>Deliverer</u> and <u>High Priest</u> of mankind.
