The diagnosis of the problem (Heb 5:11-14;
2 Tim 2:15; Luke 8:18; 1 Cor 3:1-2; 1 Cor 2:13-16)

Conclusion: Spiritual maturity is the result of a steady
hearing and application of God's word to my life.

The danger of spiritual immaturity (Heb 6:1-8)

- The problem (vs 4-8)
 - What is the context?
(Num 13-16; Heb 2:1-3; 3:7-4:11; Psalm 95:7b-11)
 - How does it relate to the previous section?
(5:11-14)
 - What is the meaning? (1 Tim 1:18-20; 4:1;
2 Tim 2:17-18; 1 Cor 5:5; Num 14:20-23, 40-45)
 - What is the point of the illustration?
(v 7-8; Gen 3:17-18; 1 Cor 3:10-15; 9:27; 2 Cor 5:10)

Conclusion: If I do not put God's truth into practice in my
life, I will be in danger of departing from the truth and
missing God's blessings and loss of future
rewards

The prescription to move toward spiritual
maturity (Heb 6:9-20)

- Remember the past (6:9-10)
- Act in the present (6:11-12; 2 Peter 1:3-4, 5, 10)
- Live for the future (6:13-20; James 2:21;
Gen 22:1-19; 2 Tim 2:11-12; Num 35:9-15; Josh 20)

Conclusion: Be diligent to keep from falling away from the
faith and press on knowing that we have a faithful God
and High Priest who has secured the way for us.
