Micah 5:2:

Initially known as: Ephrath, Ephratha (Gen 35:16; 48:7)

After the conquest of Canaan, it became known as Bethlehem of Judah (Jud 17:7; Ruth 1:1-2; 1 Sam 17:12)

Bethlehem: Beit = \underline{House} Lehem = \underline{Bread}

Located six miles south of Jerusalem, 2,300 ft elevation, and surrounded by fertile land which supplied wheat, figs, olives and vineyards.

• <u>B e n j a m i n ' s</u> Bethlehem (Gen 35:16-19; 48:7)

"The shadows of Bethlehem" show us that Jesus experienced both suffering and exaltation!

• Ruth's Bethlehem (Ruth 1:1-2,22; 4:13-22; Matt 1:5)

"The shadows of Bethlehem" show us that Jesus' royal lineage is preserved by the grace of God.

"The shadows of Bethlehem" show us that Jesus is the promised king of David's royal h o u s e.

"The shadows of Bethlehem" show us that the <u>e t e r n a l</u> king will come forth from an <u>i n s i q n i f i c a n t</u> beginning

Bethlehem's <u>e x p e c t a t i o n</u> of the <u>C r o s s</u>
(Matt 2:9-12; Mark 8:31-32; 10:45; John 12:23-28)

"The shadows of Bethlehem" show us that Jesus was the only man ever born for suffering and death.
