- If we reject God's Word, He will take it away from us
(1 Sam 28:1-6; Prov 1:28-31; Matt 13:12)
- If we continue to reject God's counsel, we will end up
pursuing darkness (1 Sam 28:7-14; Deut 18:9-13;
Rom 1:21-23)
- God's truth does not change to fit my desires
(1 Sam 28:15-19; Dan 3:16-18; Acts 1:6-8)
**I am persuaded that God brought this final word of
judgment to a king who insisted on going his own
way. (vs 15-19; Num 23:21-35)
- There is a point where we will suffer the
consequences of our sin
(1 Sam 28:21-25; 1 Cor 5:1-5)

Life Lessons:

1. When God's Word becomes unpleasant to us, we begin
to find it easy to look for answers in wrong places.
(Rom 1:18-23)
2. If we stubbornly rebel against God, He will stop revealing
Himself and His will to us (Rom 1:28-32)
3. If we continue living in constant, willful rebellion,
there is a point of "no return" where God ceases to convict
us, but allows us to go our own way.
(Rom 1:24; 1 Tim 1:18-20; 1 John 5:13-17)
4. We are to seek the Lord, abide in Christ and obey His
word. (Isa 55:6; Matt 6:33; John 15:5-8; 1 Sam 15:22;
John 14:23)
