Three sources of tangible e v i d e n c e for the *truth* of the Bible include:

• **Science** (*Psalm 33:6-11; 119:7-11*)

Concerning

- the e a r t h (Isa 40:22; Job 26:7)
- p h y s i c a l and b i o l o g i c a l phenomena (Psalm 8:4-8; Job 36:27-29; Eccl 1:6-7; Job 36:16)
- M e d i c a l issues and human h e a l t h (Deut 23:12-13; Lev 15:13; Gen 17:12)

• **History** (*Isaiah 40:6-8*)

- N a t i o n s (Gen 15:20; 1 Ki 10:29; Jonah 3-4)
- E v e n t s (Josh 6; 2 Kings 3:4-27)
- P e o p l e (Daniel 5; John 18:28-19:15)

• **Prophecy** (*2 Peter 1:19-21; Isaiah 48:3-6a*)

Concerning

- N a t i o n s (Dan 2, 7-8; Amos 1-2)
- E v e n t s
  - *Deliverance* (Ex 3:7-10; Judges 7:7; 2 Kings 19)

**So what?....**

The Bible has proven itself to be true and reliable concerning k n o w l e d g e (*Science*); the p a s t (*History*) and the f u t u r e (*Prophecy*)... could it be that it *is* true and reliable concerning what it says about you and I today?

**Only y o u can answer that question.**

**Evidence for the reliability of the Bible in the area of:**

**SCIENCE** (only a partial list)

- **Limitless number of stars (Jer 33:22)**  
Not until 1600's and telescope did people believe this
- **Air has weight (Job 28:25)**  
It was believed that air was weightless
- **Light is in motion (Job 28:25)**  
Previous belief was that light was fixed in place
- **Blood is the source of life and healing (Lev 17:11)**  
It was believed the sick must be bled to rid the body of contaminants
- **Effect of emotions on physical health (Prov 16:24; 17:22)**
- **Control of contagious diseases (Lev 13:45-46)**

**Evidence for the reliability of the Bible in the area of:**

**HISTORY** (only a partial list)

**Mari Tablets/ Nuzi Tablets:** Excavations at these two cities in Mesopotamia verify that the customs of Abraham were consistent with the culture of 18<sup>th</sup> century B.C.

**The Moabite Stone (c 1850 A.D.)** corroborates information from the Bible concerning the reign of King Omri and King Mesha of Moab's revolt as described in 2 Kings 3:4-27

**The Black Obelisk:** depicts the Israelite King Jehu paying tribute to Shalmaneser III, king of Assyria after Assyria conquered the northern kingdom of Israel.

**The Pool of Bethesda/Bethesda:** Site where one of Jesus' healings of the crippled man occurred (John 5). Outside of the NT no evidence for the existence of the pool existed so skeptics said John was inaccurate. However, in 1888, sections of the pool were discovered in Jerusalem.

## Evidence for the reliability of the Bible in the area of:

### PROPHECY (only a partial list)

**Isaiah 45:13** – After Judah’s captivity in Babylon, Isaiah predicts that the Persian ruler Cyrus would allow the Jews to return to Jerusalem to rebuild the city. This happened about 150 years later when history verifies that Cyrus, King of Persia (559-530 BC) issued a decree in 538 BC to allow Jews to return to Jerusalem to rebuild.

**Ezekiel 26** – prophesied the destruction of Tyre (northern coast above Israel). The Jewish historian Josephus tells us that Nebuchadnezzar, king of Babylon, besieged the coastal, mainland city for 13 years (585-572 BC) and finally captured it.

Many of its citizens escaped to an island about a mile off shore where they were safe since Babylon had not ships or navy.

Two hundred and fifty years later (c 332 BC), Alexander the Great (Greek Empire) was on a campaign to another region when he was refused the honor to worship a mutual “god” in Tyre. He was ticked so he stopped his campaign and went after the island.

Using the rubble that still remained on the mainland from Babylon’s attack; he spent several years building a causeway out to the island. He literally “scraped away her rubble and made her a bare rock (Ezek 26:4). He also commandeered ally ships from Crete, Sidon and Byblos (places he already conquered) and attacked Tyre from the sea as well as the causeway. Over 8,000 in Tyre lost their lives and another 30,000 were taken as slave.

The city has never been rebuilt. Fishermen from a small village there now spread their nets and cast them from barren rocks.

Here are just a few of the hundreds of prophecies Jesus fulfilled:

Although a man might be able to fulfill one or two of these prophecies **by coincidence**, to fulfill all of them would be **impossible except by the plan of God**. In fact....

*Mathematician, Peter Stoner calculated that for one person to fulfill even EIGHT of the prophecies concerning the Messiah, it would be 1 in 10 to the 17<sup>th</sup> power. That is: 1 in 1,000,000,000,000,000 (or 1 in 10 with 17 zeros after it).*

**Josh McDowell** illustrates the probability in this way:  
*Fill the state of Texas two feet deep with silver dollars and on only one of those silver dollars, place a mark, and then throw it in. Then mix the silver dollars and blindfold a person and have them start walking across Texas until that person decided to stop and pick up a silver dollar. The chances that they would pick up the silver dollar with the mark on it, on the first try would be greater than one person fulfilling even eight of the OT prophecies concerning the Messiah.*

**But there aren't just eight prophecies about Messiah that Jesus fulfilled, but over 300!**
