

Seeing Jesus Through The Old Testament
Jesus: The Place of Deliverance and Safety
Genesis 6-9

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The Old Testament points to J e s u s (Luke 24:44;
Colossians 2:16-17; Romans 5:14; Hebrews 11:19)

- **The Flood** = a foreshadowing of God's future judgment (Matthew 24:37-38; 2 Peter 3:3-12)

- **The ark** = a picture of God's provision for deliverance in Christ (John 3:16; 1 Peter 3:18-22)

Like Noah, it is by faith that we are delivered and made secure in Christ (Hebrews 11:7)

- *Type* = a figure, representation or symbol of something to come

The Ark: Safety from judgment for sin (Genesis 6-9)

The ark....

- Was God's provision (Genesis 6:13-14; 1 Peter 2:20; Revelation 13:8)

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- Was a refuge from God's judgment
(Genesis 6:18-19; 7:7 ; Acts 4:12)
- Had only one door (Genesis 6:16; John 10:9; 14:6)
- Was the place God called people to enter for safety
(Genesis 7:1,7; Matthew 11:28-30; Acts 16:31)
- Passed through the waters of judgment
(Genesis 7:17-24; 2 Corinthians 5:21; 1 Peter 3:18-20)
- Was the place of absolute security from judgment
(Genesis 6:14; 7:16; 8:18-19; Colossians 3:3; 1 Peter 1:5; John 18:9)
- Brought Noah and his family through the judgment to a new creation (Genesis 8:13-17; 2 Corinthians 5:17; 2 Peter 2:5; 3:13; Revelation 21:4-5)

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
