 The ark = a picture of God's <u>provision</u> for <u>deliverance</u> in Christ (John 3:16; 1 Peter 3:18-22)

Like Noah, it is by <u>f a i t h</u> that we are <u>d e l i v e r e d</u> and made <u>s e c u r e</u> in Christ (Hebrews 11:7)


