It is a superior priesthood because:

offered no lasting righteousness and peace	offers <u>e t e r n a l</u> righteousness and peace
was based on <u>h e r e d i t y</u>	is based on <u>p e r s o n a l</u> merit
was <u>t e m p o r a l</u>	is <u>eternal</u>

God ordained Jesus a High Priest that would not be *limited* in scope, authority, power, blessing or time – a priesthood initiated after the order of *Melchizedek*! (Psalm 100:1-4; Heb 5:8-10; 6:19-20; 8:1-2)

Who is Melchizedek? (Genesis 14:17-24; Ps 110:1-4)

There are a grand total of <u>f o u r v e r s e s</u> in <u>t w o b o o k s</u> of the Old Testament that mention Melchizedek

- Genesis 14:17-20
- Psalm 110:4

Melchizedek (Gen 14:17-20):

- is the King of Salem (v 18)
- is the <u>priest</u> of the *Most High God* (v18)
- provided Abraham and his men <u>b r e a d</u> and <u>w i n e</u> (v 18)
- <u>b l e s s e s</u> Abraham (vs 19-20)
- receives a tenth of the bootv from Abraham (v 20)

Some suggest that Melchizedek was:

- An angel
- Noah's son Shem
- A C h r i s t o p h a n y (a pre-incarnate appearance of Christ)
- Simply a man

About a <u>t h o u s a n d</u> years later, he appears again in a M e s s i a n i c prophecy (Psalm 110:4)

 Melchizedek is an amazing proof of the <u>i n s p i r a t i o n</u> and <u>u n i t y</u> of the Bible

What is the <u>significance</u> of Melchizedek? (Hebrews 7:1-28)

Melchizedek is a picture of the <u>superior High Priestly</u> ministry of Jesus Christ over the Aaronic priesthood (Heb 7:1-3)

Consider these comparisons...

His name:

- Melchizedek means "King of Righteousness" (Heb 7:2; Ps 85:13; 89:14; Isa 9:7)
- \rightarrow Melek = kinq
- > Zedek = righteousness

His title:

King of Salem = King of p e a c e - "s h a l o m"
 (Heb 7:1; Isa 9:6; John 14:27; 18:33-37)

His <u>service</u>:

- A priest of the Most High God (Heb 7:1; Zech 6:13; Heb 5:8-10; 1 Tim 2:5; 1 Pet 2:24; 2 Cor 5:21)
- Offers bread and wine
 (Matt 26:26-29; Luke 22:14-20; 1 Cor 11:23-26)

His greatness:

- Abraham is blessed by Melchizedek (Heb 7:1; John 8:56; Gal 3:14)
- Abraham tithed to Melchizedek
 (Heb 7:2, 4-10; Luke 11:31-32; John 8:53)

His <u>origin</u>:

 Without <u>b e g i n n i n g</u> or <u>e n d</u> of life (Heb 7:3; John 1:1; 8:58)

His priesthood:

- Is not according to the <u>Levitical</u> line (Heb 7:11-22)
- Is not <u>limited</u> by <u>death</u> (Heb 7:23-25)
- Is not performed in <u>weakness</u> but in <u>perfection</u> (Heb 7:26-28)
