Introduction to the Book of Job

The *Time* of the Book of Job: <u>2000 - 1800 B C</u>

The Author of the Book of Job: uncertain

The *Theme* of the Book of Job: God is <u>worthy</u> of my <u>worship</u>

Job demonstrates that God is worthy of my worship:

- when things are <u>g o o d</u> (Job 1:1-5)
- when things are <u>b a d</u> (Job 1:6-37:24)
- when I am <u>confused</u> and <u>disillusioned</u>
 (Job 38:1-41:34)
- because He is God and I am not (Job 42)

Godly character will not go unnoticed (Job 1:1-10)

It is reflected:

- in my <u>lifestyle</u> (v 1)
- through my <u>f a m i l y</u> (v 2, 4-5)
- in mystewardship (v3)

A godly character will be noticed:

- by <u>G o d</u> (v 8)
- by <u>Satan</u> as well (vs 9-10)

Godly character *does not* <u>p r e c l u d e a d v e r s i t y</u> (Job 1:11-22)

We have an enemy:

- who seeks our <u>defection</u> (v 11)
- whose power is <u>limited</u> by God's <u>authority</u> (v 12)

Adversity:

- may come in the form of <u>personal</u> loss (vs 13-19)
- reveals ourtrue character (vs 20-22)

Point: I can <u>b I a m e</u> God or I can <u>w o r s h i p</u> God
