We can become so tied to our traditions and dogmas

that we $\underline{m i s s}$ the $\underline{n e e d}$ of our friends (Job 8:1-22)

- It happens when we focus on one facet of God's
 character (vs 1-7; Proverb 22:25; 15:23)
- It happens when we hold to <u>tradition</u> over the <u>truth</u> of God's <u>word</u> (vs 8-10; Philippians 3:13-14)
- It happens when we issue <u>conclusions</u> that are in <u>conflict</u> with the present <u>reality</u>
 (vs 11-22; Matthew 27:43)

When others are suffering, it is more helpful for us to <u>h e a r</u> and <u>u n d e r s t a n d</u> the deeper <u>q u e s t i o n s</u> they are wrestling with (Job 9:1-10:22)

They may have questions that involve their:

- relationship with God (9:1-13)
- opportunity to approach God with their concerns (9:14-35)
 - ° sometimes God seems so <u>r a n d o m</u> (vs 14-24)
 - ° sometimes God seems so <u>u n f a i r</u> (vs 25-35)
- questions about their <u>purpose</u> in life (10:1-22)
